Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minneseta:

Section 1. That Reuben Richmond and John L. Wilson, their heirs, Ferry executors, administrators, or assigns, shall have the exclusive right and privilege for the period of twenty years, of keeping and maintaining a Ferry across the Mississippi river in the counties of Stearns and Benton. in the Territory of Minnesota, at a point near or opposite the town of St. Augusta. And no other ferry shall be established within one mile of said ferry either above or below.

SEC. 2. That said Reuben Richmond and John L. Wilson shall at all Keep good be times keep a safe and good boat or boats, in good repair, sufficient for the accommodation of all persons wishing to cross at said ferry, and shall give prompt and ready attendance for the crossing of passengers, teams or live stock, merchandise and all other articles, on all occasions and at all hours, both at night and day; but persons wishing to cross at said ferry after nine o'clock at night may be charged double fare as hereinafter prescribed.
