CHAPTER XLII.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the election of county and precinct officers in and Election for the county of Rice, held at the several precincts in said county on the 9th of October, A.D., 1855, is hereby ratified and confirmed.

That the official acts of said county and precinct officers done, performed or exercised in accordance with the law made and provided for Acia of Officers the regulation and action of such officers shall be valid, and binding upon all persons whomsoever both in law and equity, any non-compliance with the statutory details in the election or qualification of said officers, notwithstanding.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

An Act to secure the free passage of Logs and Lumber down Cannon River.

Section 1. Cannon River declared a public highway, so far as to prevent the obstruction of lumber.

SECTION 1. That the Cannon River from its junction with the Mississippi to Cannon Lake, be and the same is hereby declared to be a public highway so far as to prevent the obstruction of the passage of logs and lumber down said stream.
