SEC. 2. The Sheriff of said county is hereby authorized and Collect tax empowered to proceed and collect said taxes as fully as he could do in the life time of his warrant, and to make out a statement of the taxes remaining unpaid, and submit the same to the Register of Deeds on or before the first Monday

, in July, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That it shall be the duty of Register of Deeds after giving notice as prescribed by Sell land law, to sell the lands returned to him upon which taxes remain unpaid on the first Monday of November, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, and the succeeding days until all be sold, any law of this Territory to the contrary notwithstanding.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the county of Freeborn is hereby declared Organized an organized county with all the immunities of other organ-

ized counties of this Territory.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the Governor of this Territory to appoint the Board of County Commissioners and the Board of Com-Register of Deeds for said County and the said Board of missioners. County Commissioners shall have power and it is hereby made their duty to appoint all other county officers contemplated by law in organized counties.

Sec. 3. All the officers appointed as above, shall, before Oath

entering upon the duties of their offices, be qualified as the law directs in cases of an election and shall continue in office until the first day of January following their appointment and until their successors are elected and qualified.

The Board of County Commissioners shall appoint a place for a temporary county seat in said county until a

place shall be determined by the voice of the people.

A poll shall be opened on the day of the first general election after the organization of said county, that the voters of said county may determine by ballot the place for Vote by ballot county seat of said county and the place having the highest number of votes shall be the permanent county seat.
