ville, Forestville, Spring Valley, Pleasant Valley, High Forest, and Mantorville to Cannon Falls, in Minnesota Territory, would be of material advantage to a large number of settlers along the line of said route, the same being one of the principal thoroughfares leading from Minnesota into the State of lowa, and the towns and neighborhoods along said route being almost destitute of mail facilities; your memorialists therefore respectfully and earnestly recommend the establishment of said mail route.
