Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That each and every of the following named person or persons, their heirs, executors, administrators, assigns, and legal representatives shall have the exclusive right to establish and maintain Ferries across the navigable streams within this Territory. Also across streams that are navigable that form in part the boundaries of this Territory, at the points or places hereafter designated, the said exclusive right to remain to them for the space of fifteen years, subject to all the provisions herein and hereafter provided.

All freight, lumber, merchandise, or other articles not in teams, at the rate of ten cents per barrel, 50 cents per thousand feet of lumber, and 5 cents per pound for all other articles.

SEC. 7. The rates for crossing at each of said Ferries in the foregoing Section shall not exceed the following rates, except to those crossing between the hours of 8 P. M. and 5 A. M., when they may collect double rates, viz: For each foot passenger, 10 conts; for each horse, mare or mule, with or without rider, 15 cents; for each two horse, two ox or two mule team, 25 cents; for each single horse carriage, 20 cents; for each additional cow or ox, 10 cents; for each swine or sheep, 3 cents; lumber per thousand feet, 50 cents; freight or merchandise per barrel, 10 cents. All other artiticles per hundred pounds, 3 cents.

Also granting to J. B. Culva, across the head of the Bay of Superior, from Portage street, in the town of Du Grant to J.B. Luth, to Rice's Point. And the rates for crossing said Ferry Culva, and shall not exceed the following, viz: Each foot passenger, 50 cents; each horse, mare, mule, or ass, with or without rider, 50 cents; each two horse, two ox, two mule team, with or without driver, \$1,00; each single carriage, 75 cents;

All other articles, per hundred pounds, 10 cents. Double the above rates may be collected of those crossing between the hours of 8. P. M. and 4 A. M.

Sec. 9. That within six months after the passage of this act, the persons authorized to keep each ferry under the provisions hereof, shall file with the register of deeds of the senior County, when the ferry shall be on a stream dividing be filed. two Counties, at the point where said ferry is located, or in the County in which the ferry may be located, a bond to the board of County Commissioners, and to be approved by the said board, in the penal sum of five hundred dollars, conditioned that all the duties that are imposed in this act shall be faithfully complied with, and in case of failure, so to do all the benefit which might have accrued to the person or persons failing to file said bond under the provisions of this act, shall be forfeited; Provided, That if said Forry shall not be located in, or connected with an organized County, then the bond herein required shall be filed within six months after the Register of Deeds for the County with which said Ferry connects shall have qualified.

Sec. 10. That each person or persons hereby authorised to establish and maintain a Ferry, or their legal representatives, shall within six months from the passage hereof, keep a safe be kept, and and good boat or boats, in good repair, sufficient for all persons wishing to cross their said Ferry, and shall give prompt and ready attendance to passengers, teams, and live stock on all occasions, and at all hours, both day and night. And any person or persons who shall sustain any injury by the negligence of any person or persons authorized by this act to establish and maintain a Ferry, may have a remedy by an action on the bond filed by such person or persons authorized to keep the Ferry where such damage shall have been sustained, to be recovered by a civil action before any court

having competent jurisdiction.

SEC. 11. In all cases where any person or persons are authorized by this act to establish and maintain a Ferry across any stream which divides the Counties within this Territory, at the point where such Ferry is established, the right shall be valid in both Counties, although but one County may be named in this act.

SEC. 12. The Legislature may alter or amend the provis-



Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

Section 1. That so much of the Territory of Minnesota as oundary of hereby established as the County of Martin: Beginning at Boundary the south-west corner of township one hundred and one (101) ty. north, of range twenty-eight (28) west; thence running due
