Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesola:
-Srotion 1. That each and every of the following named person or persons, their heirs, executors, administrators, assigns, and legal representatives shall have the exclusive right to establish and maintain Ferries across the navigable strearns within this Territory. Also across streams that are navigable that form in part the boundaries of this Territory, at the points or places hereafter designated, the said exclusive right to remain to them for the spacc of fifteen years, subject to all the provisions herein and hereafter provided.

12th-To Thomas Cathcart and Deniel Burnam, across the Thos. Cathourt Mississippi and Crow Wing Rivers, at Crow Wing City, in and Daniel the County of Todd.

Scc. 3. The rates charged for crossing at cach of the above named Ferrics shall not exceed the following, except to those crossing between 8 o'clock P. M. and $6 o^{\prime}$ clock A. M., when double the following rates may be charged, viz: For each foot passenger, 10 cents; for cach horsc, mare, mule, with or without rider, 15 cents; for each cow or ox, 15 cents; for two horse, two ox, or two mule team, loaded or unloaded, with driver, 25 cents; for each-single horse carriage, 25 cents; for cach additional horse, mule, ox or cow, 15 cents; for cach swine, or sheep, or goat, 5 cents. All freight, lumber, merchandise, or other articles not in teams, at the rate of ten cents per barrel, 50 cents per thousand feet of lumber, and 5 cents per pound for all other articles.

Sgo. 7. The rates for crossing at each of said Ferrics in the foregoing Section shall not exceed the following rates, except to those crossing between the hours of 8 P. M. and 5 A. M., when they may collect double rates, viz: For cach shall not exceed the following, viz: Each foot passenger, 50 cents; each horse, mare, mule, or ass, with or without rider, 50 cents; each two horse, two ox, two mule team, with or without driver, $\$ 1,00$; each single carriage, 75 cents;
each additional cow, horse, marc, or ox, 13 cents; cach swine or sheep, 5 cents; lumber per thousand feet, 60 cents; all freight or merchandise, per barrel, 15 centa. All other articles, per hundred pounds, 10 conts. Double the above rates may be collected of those crossing between the hours of 8 P. M. and 4 A. M.

Sev. 9. That within six months after the passage of this act, the persons authorized to kecp each ferry under the provisions hereof, shall file with the register of deeds of the senior County, when the ferry shall be on a stream dividing two Counties, at the point where said ferry is located, or in the County in which the ferry may be located, a bond to the board of County Commissioners, and to bo approved by the said board, in the penal sum of five hundred dollars, conditioned that all the duties that are imposed in this act shall be faithfully complicd with, and in case of failure, so to do all the bencfit which might have accrued to the person or persons failing to file said bond under the provisions of this act, shall be forfeited; Provided, That if said Ferry shall not be located in, or connected with an organized County, then the bond leerein required sball be filed within six months after the Register of Deeds for the County with whieh said Ferry connects shall have qualified.

Skc. 10. That each person or persons lhereby authorised to establish and maintain a lierry, or their legal representatives, shall within six months from the passage hereof, keep a safe and good boat or boats, in good repair, sufficient for all persons wishing to cross their said Ferry, and shall give prompt and ready attendance to passengers, teams, and live stock on all occasions, and at all hours, both day and night. And any person or persous who shall sustain any injury by the negligence of any person or persons authorized by this act to establish and maintain a Ferry, may have a remedy by an action on the bond filed by such person or persons authorized to keep the Ferry where such damage shall hare been sustained, to be recovered by a oivil action before any court having competent jurisdiction.

Ssc. 11. In all cases where any person or persons are authorized by this act to establish and maintain a Ferry across any stream which divides the Counties within this Territory, at the point where such Ferry is established, the right shall be valid in both Counties, although but one County may be named in this act.

Sec. 12. The Legislature may alter or amend the provisions of this act at any time.

Szc. 13. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

Sgo. 14. That none of the grants contained in this act Not to intershall interfere with any former acts granting Ferry charters to other and different individuals.

Sko. 15. That no Ferry shall be established within onehalf mile either way of the exclusive rights herein given.

- Also, that shall any of the within granted exclusive rights Confict with conflict with charters heretofore granted, and the said ohartersgrantees having not complied with existing laws thereto harotofore relating, then these grants shall take preference, and shall so be construed in law.
