CHAPTER XXII.

An Act Authorizing the Proprietors of the Town of Carver to cause the same to be Surveyed, and a new Plat thereof Recorded.

- SECTION 1. Lands to be surveyed and recorded.
2 Legal plat of Carver.
3 Take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

Carver incor-
porated

SECTION 1. That the proprietors of the town of Carver, in the county of Carver, be, and the same are hereby authorized to cause all the following described lands, viz: lots numbered six (6,) and seven, (7), of section numbered seventeen, (17,) and the west half of the south-east quarter, and the north east quarter of the south east quarter, and lot numbered one, (1,) of section numbered eighteen, (18,) and the north west quarter of the north east quarter, and lot numbered two, (2), and the east half of the south west quarter, and the north east quarter of the north-west quarter of section numbered nineteen, (19,) all in township numbered one hundred and fifteen, (115), of range numbered twenty-three, (23,) to be surveyed and a plat thereof made and acknowledged, and to cause such plat to be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of said county.

Legal plat

SEC. 2. The plat made, acknowledged and recorded as aforesaid, shall be, and shall be known in law, as the legal plat of the town of Carver, any other plat heretofore recorded to the contrary notwithstanding.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
