Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

Corporators

Section 1. That Ard. de Groff, John B. Brisbin, John H. Harmon, E. M. McCork, James H. Smith, David H. Nickle, Henry B. Towsley, A. H. Newbold, James Ludington, Daniel Wells, Jr., Daniel P. Bushnell, Samuel Hale, and E. L. King, and such other persons as may become associated with them in the manner hereinafter prescribed, are hereby created a body corporate by the name and title of the Minnesota and Dakota Land Company, and by that name shall be and hereby are made capable in law and equity to purchase, hold convey both real and personal estate, lands, tenements, and and hereditaments to grant, lease, or in any manner dispose of the same; to borrow money and mortgage the property of the Company to secure the same, to sue and be sued, to have and use a common seal, and to do and transact all and sev, eral in their corporate capacity, those things which they might do individually.

Sec. 2. All the corporate powers of said Company shall be vested in and controlled by a Board of Directors, and

such officers and agents as they shall appoint.

SEC. 3. The Board of Directors of the Company hereby created, is hereby authorized and empowered to open books at Board of such place or places or at such time or times as they may rectors

see proper; and receive subscriptions to the capital stock of

The said Directors shall have power to make, ordain, or establish all such By-Laws, rules and regulations, as they may deem expedient or necessary for the government of the Company, and for the well ordering, regulating and securing their business affairs, and such By-Laws, rules and regulations shall have the force and effect of law; Provided, The same be not inconsistent with, or repugnant to the laws of the United States or of the Territory of Minnesota.
