

property of the institution shall be held for the just performance and payment of the same.

SEC. 15. The Treasurer before entering upon the duties of his office, shall give bonds satisfactory to the Trustees for the faithful performance of his duties. ^{Give bonds}

SEC. 16. The said Trustees shall have power to enact all by-laws necessary for the control of said institution, and the management of its affairs, to employ all necessary teachers and regulate their salaries, but the said Trustees or officers shall receive no pay for their own services. ^{Enact by laws}

SEC. 17. No religious test shall be required to entitle any person to be admitted as a teacher or student in said institution, nor shall any sectarian doctrine be taught or tolerated therein. ^{No religious test required}

SEC. 18. Any three of the Trustees named in this act, may call the first meeting of the Trustees, by posting written notices of the same in two public places in the town of Greenville, for two weeks previous to such meeting. ^{Call first meeting}

SEC. 19. The Legislature may at any time alter, modify or amend this act. ^{Alter or amend}

CHAPTER LXXXV.

An Act to amend "an Act to incorporate the St. Cloud Bridge Company, approved March 1, 1856."

SECTION 1 Bridge to be built in the original town limits.
2 Act to take effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

Authorized to build in original town limits

SECTION 1. That nothing in the Act to which this is amendatory shall be construed, so as to authorize said Company to build said bridge out of the limits of the original town of St. Cloud, as recorded in the office of Register of Deeds for Benton county.

Take effect

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXXVI.

A Bill to Incorporate the Glencoe Library Association.

- SECTION 1 Incorporators and powers of Incorporation.
2 Power to enjoy real and personal Property.
3 May make by-laws, and adopt a seal.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

Incorporators

SECTION 1. Lymon G. Simons, James Philips, C. Chandler, B. F. Buck, John H. Stevens, A. Jackson Bell, Wm. S. Chapman, and their associates, be and they are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic by the name of the Glencoe Library Association, for the purpose of establishing and preserving a Library at Glencoe, and by that name shall enjoy all the privileges and franchises, and be subject to all the liabilities incident to a Corporation.

Powers

Buy, sell and hold property

SEC. 2. Said Corporation may buy, sell and hold property, both real and personal for the use and purposes of said Library
