Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. The sum of twenty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the payment of per diem, mileage, stationary, and postages of the members and officers of the present Legislature. Legislative fund

SEC. 2. The sum of two thousand five hundred dollars is appropriated for payment of the Governor's salary for the present year, and the sum of one thousand dollars is also appropriated to the order of the Governor as an executive contingent fund for State purposes. Governor's salary and contingent fund

SEC. 3. The sum one thousand five hundred dollars is hereby appropriated for the salary of the Secretary of State for the present year. Secretary of state

SEC. 4. The sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the payment of the salary of the Attorney General for the present year. Attorney general

SEC. 5. The sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appro-

Treasurer	<p> appropriated for the payment of the salary of the State Treasurer for the present year.</p>
Auditor	<p> SEC. 6. The sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the payment of the salary of the State Auditor for the present year.</p>
Judge and clerks of supreme court	<p> SEC. 7. The sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for payment of the salaries of the Judges of the Supreme Court, and one thousand eight hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the payment of the salary of the Clerk of the Supreme Court ; also, two hundred dollars for contingent expenses of said Court.</p>
Judge of district court	<p> SEC. 8. The sum of twelve thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the payment of the salaries of the Judges of the District Court.</p>
Lithographer	<p> SEC. 9. The following sums are likewise hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, on presentation of proper vouchers, or certificates for the same, to wit :</p>
Engraving bonds	<p> For expenses of lithographing and issuing treasury drafts, a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars. For expenses incidental to the engraving and negotiating \$250,000 of State Bonds, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.</p>
Safe for treasurer	<p> For the purchase of a fire and burglar proof iron safe, for the office of the State Treasurer, a sum not exceeding six hundred dollars.</p>
Clerk for treasurer	<p> For clerk hire in the office of the State Treasurer, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.</p>
Clerk for auditor	<p> For clerk hire in the office of the Auditor [of State,] a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars.</p>
Contingent funds for auditor and treasurer	<p> For contingent fund to the order of the Auditor of State, to be used for State purposes, three hundred dollars. For contingent fund to the order of the State Treasurer, to be used for State purposes, three hundred dollars.</p>
Interest on territorial bonds	<p> For unappropriated balance to meet principal and interest of bonds issued by Act approved May 23, 1857, and falling due May 27, 1858, three hundred dollars.</p>
Interest on state loan	<p> For the payment of the first instalment of interest on proposed loan of \$250,000, the sum of twelve thousand five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be required.</p>
Supreme court reports	<p> For bringing up and completing the Supreme Court reports, ordered by Act of February 28, 1856, six hundred dollars.</p>
Repairs on capitol	<p> For necessary repairs and care of the Capitol, to be expended at the discretion of the Governor, the sum of five hundred dollars.</p>
Printing journal and laws	<p> To Earle S. Goodrich, for printing 3000 copies of Session Laws, and 1000 copies of the Journal of each House Session of 1858, the sum of (\$10,000) ten thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.</p>

To E. C. Rich, in full for furniture furnished Capitol, one hundred and fifteen dollars. Furniture

To H. E. Baker & Co., in full for hardware, stoves, &c., furnished House and Senate up to date, one hundred and fifty-six dollars and seventy-three cents. Stoves &c

To S. S. Gale & Co., in full for candles furnished Capitol, the sum of fourteen dollars. Candles

For unpaid balance due W. A. Hotchkiss, or assignees, for printing Journals and Session Laws of the Sixth Session of the Territorial Legislature, and preparing indexes, &c., four thousand seven hundred and four dollars and three cents, to be paid out of the Legislative fund for the year 1859. Territorial printing

To C. L. Emerson, for balance due him for the incidental printing of the Territorial Legislature of 1855, and appropriated by said Legislature to the name of Hotchkiss, Staples & Jones, to be paid out of the sum appropriated by Congress for said Session, and still unpaid, the sum of four thousand five hundred and fifty-two dollars and eight cents; also, to the said C. L. Emerson, the further sum of one hundred and eight dollars and fifty-cents, for newspapers furnished the members of said Legislature, being a sum also found to have been appropriated out of said Congressional fund, and unpaid, said sums to be paid out of the Legislative fund for the year 1859. Territorial printing

To W. F. Wheeler, for copying Memorials to Congress for this Legislature, twenty-five dollars. Copying memorials

To Earle S. Goodrich, for newspapers furnished members of this Legislature, three thousand three hundred and fifty-seven dollars and ninety-seven cents. Newspapers for legislature

To J. W. Brockett, for extra services as Clerk of the Council, 1857, appropriated from Congressional fund unpaid, the sum of fifty dollars. Clerk of council for 1857

To Goodrich, Somers & Co., for publishing Session Laws of 1858, \$234 75. Session laws 1858

To T. M. Newson, for newspapers furnished members of the Legislature, nine hundred and seven dollars and eighty-four cents; also, to the same, the further sum of forty dollars for publishing Loan Act. Papers and loan bill

To Saint Paul Advertiser, for newspapers furnished members of this Legislature, one hundred and thirty-two dollars and forty-two cents; and to the same, twenty-five dollars for publishing \$5,000,000 Loan Bill. Newspapers and loan bill

To Nicols, Kinne & Co, for hardware, spittoons, &c., furnished Capitol buildings, thirty-two dollars and fifty cents. Spittoons &c

To Golcher & Simpson, as payment in full for locksmith work, &c., fifty-nine dollars and fifty cents. Locksmith work

To Parker Paine, in full for firewood furnished Capitol by W. C. Gray, four hundred and thirty-eight dollars. Wood

To J. W. Crosby, for repairing plastering in Capitol building, twenty-eight dollars. Plastering

- Fire in com rooms** To John Young, for making fires in the Committee rooms, at fifty cents per day, twenty-five dollars and fifty cents.
- Territorial printing** To Owens & Moore, assignees of Thos. Foster, for unpaid balance of account for incidental printing of the House of Representatives of 1857, the sum of eight hundred and one dollars and two cents.
- Maps** To Holmes, Payte & Buechner, as payment in full for two Maps of Minnesota furnished House of Representatives, the sum of three hundred dollars.
- Newspapers** For newspapers furnished members of the Legislature, for which vouchers have not yet been sent in, one thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary.
- Stationary for clerk of house** To Combs & Brother, for stationery, &c., furnished the order of the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, seven hundred dollars and thirty cents.
- For secretary of senate** To Combs & Brother for stationery, &c., furnished to the order of the Secretary of the Senate, three hundred and fifty dollars and seventy cents.
- Maps** To Sewall & Iddings, in full, for Map furnished Senate, one hundred and fifty dollars.
- Newspapers** To Foster & Moore, for newspapers furnished the members of the present Legislature, six hundred and ninety-nine dollars and eighty-four cents.
- Newspapers** To *Glencoe Register*, for newspapers furnished members and officers of this Legislature, twenty-one dollars and eighty cents.
- Newspapers** To the *Henderson Democrat*, for newspapers supplied members of the Legislature, 1857-1858, the sum of twenty-seven dollars.
- Sawing wood** To James Burns, the sum of \$90 for sawing wood for the Capitol.

SEC. 10. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
