CHAPTER XLIX.

An Act relating to the powers and duties of the District Courts and District Judges.

SECTION I. On transfer of Records from Territorial Courts, District Judges to have same authority as if originating in District Court of State.

 In cases not heretofore provided by law, Judges of District Court to exer is a suthority, same as Judges of Territorial Courts.

5. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That whenever the records of the proceedings in the several cases in which judgments or decrees have been ordered or rendered in the late Territorial Courts, shall Powers of district be transferred to and deposited in the District Courts of the from territorial State, the said District Courts and the Judges thereof shall court possess the same powers, and perform the same duties in reference to such judgments and decrees as if the same had been ordered or rendered in said District Courts.

SEC. 2. In all cases not heretofore otherwise provided for by law, the District Courts and District Judges of the State, shall possess and exercise the same powers, general and special, and perform the same duties as the District Courts and District Judges of the late Territory of Minnesota.

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
