

Impeachment, resignation or removal of governor or removal of the Governor from office, the Lieutenant Governor shall exercise the office of Governor, until he be acquitted, or another Governor shall be duly qualified. And in case of the impeachment of the Lieutenant Governor, or his death, removal from office, resignation, or absence from the State, the President of the Senate shall succeed to the office and exercise the duties thereof, until a Governor shall be elected and qualified.

Prohibition to hold office of governor SEC. 11. No member of Congress, or person holding any office under the United States or this State, shall execute the office of Governor.

Private secretary - his duties SEC. 12. The Governor shall appoint his Private Secretary, who shall enter in a book kept for that purpose, all such letters written by and to the Governor, as are official and important; and such other letters as the Governor shall deem necessary. Said book shall be deposited in the office of the executive by the Private Secretary, and carefully preserved, and the Governor shall produce the letter books before the Legislature whenever requested.

SEC. 13. Whenever the great seal of the State, shall be lost, or so worn or defaced as to render it unfit for use, the Governor shall provide a new one.

SEC. 14. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

An Act to authorize the Governor to select Lands, and secure the title thereof.

SECTION 1. The Governor authorized to appoint a Commissioner to select lands to complete public buildings.

2. Selection of Salt Springs and lands granted by Enabling Act of Congress.
3. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the Governor of this State is hereby au-

thorised to appoint a Commission, consisting of one or more persons, to assist him in the selection of certain lands granted to the State of Minnesota for the purpose of completing the Public Building, or for the erection of others at the Seat of Government, and also to take such measures as shall secure the title of said lands, when thus selected for the State.

Commission to be appointed to select lands—donation by United States

SEC. 2. That the Governor shall select or appoint some suitable person or persons to make the selection of the twelve Salt Springs and six sections of land granted to this State by the Enabling Act, and take such measures as are necessary to secure a title thereto.

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXXIX.

An Act to provide for the Salaries of the Judges of the Supreme and District Courts.

- SECTION 1. Salaries of the Judges of the Supreme Court.
 2. Salaries of the Judges of the District Court.
 3. Salaries to be paid quarterly on the order of the Auditor.
 4. Terms of office of the Judges.
 5. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the Chief Justice and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court shall severally receive a salary of two thousand dollars per annum.
