

Amendment to

SEC. 2. That for the good order and government of said town, J. M. Walker, shall be President, F. G. Gould, Secretary, H. Hardecn, N. Carswell, and E. Pierson, Trustees. Said President, Secretary and Trustees shall constitute a Town Council of said town, and three of whom shall constitute a quorum to transact business, and shall continue in office until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

SEC. 3. That the qualified voters of said town shall meet at the usual place of holding elections in said town, on the second Tuesday of September, and annually thereafter, to elect one President, one Secretary and three Trustees, who shall constitute the Town Council of said town.

CHAPTER CXXII.

An Act to Incorporate the Town of Maple Lake, Wright County.

- SECTION 1. Boundaries of the Town.
2. First Town officers.
3. Authority to enter Town site.
4. Act to take effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Boundaries of
the town

SECTION 1. That so much land in township 121 north, and range 26 west, as is surveyed mapped and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Wright county, and known as "Geneva," be and the same is hereby created a town corporate by the name of Maple Lake, with all the power, privileges and responsibilities usually enjoyed by municipal corporations.

SEC. 2. That James C. Beekman, Ira H. Keen, and Charles B. Jordan, are hereby appointed Trustees of said town, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified; and the corporate name of said town organization shall be, "the Town Council of Maple Lake."

SEC. 3. That the Trustees of said town shall have power to enter so much land within the corporate limits of said town as can be entered under the provisions of the act of Congress entitled "An Act for the relief of citizens of towns upon the lands of the United States under certain circumstances," approved May 23d 1844.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CXXIII.

An Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to Incorporate the City of Winona, approved March 6, 1857.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Chapter 41, Regular Session Laws of 1857, relating to a change in the City Boundaries.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That Section one of Chapter one, of an Act entitled An Act to incorporate the city of Winona, approved March 7, 1857, be amended so as to read as follows :

SEC. 1. That territory included within the following boundaries and limits, shall constitute the city of Winona, beginning at a point in the middle of the Mississippi river, on
