D. eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

First town of acres

Sec. 2. That G. Soloyus shall be President; C. W. Idings shall be Recorder, and John Niinger, John V. Wren and B. Densmore shall be Trustees of the Town of Eskewaju, and shall hold their offices until their successors are duly elected and qualified under the Act above referred to.

CHAPTER CLXVII.

An Act to Incorporate the Town of Yarmouth.

- SECTION 1. Boundaries of the Town.
 2. Corporate officers, how elected.
 3. Town site to be entered by the President and Secretary.
 4. To have the privileges and be subject to the liabilities in the incorporation Act of the Town of Wilton.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Boundaries of the town

SECTION 1. That so much land, not exceeding three hundred and twenty (320) acres, in township one hundred and twenty-two (122), north of range twenty-nine (29), west of the fifth principal meridian, as is surveyed and platted as the town site of Yarmouth, be, and the same is hereby created a town corporate by the name of Yarmouth.

Sec. 2. That for the good order and government of said town it shall be lawful, and there shall be established a Town Council of said town, consisting of a President, Secretary and three Trustees, who shall hold their office for one year and until their successors are elected and qualified, any three of whom shall be a quorum for the transaction of business, and that George W. Cutter shall be the first President, and W. H. Bradley the first Secretary of said Town Council.

Officers how elected

Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of the President and Secretary of said Town Council to enter so much land within the corporate limits of said town, as can be entered under the provisions of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act for the relief of the citizens of towns upon the lands of the United States, under certain circumstances," approved May twenty-three, eighteen hundred and forty-four.

Town site to be entered

Sec. 4. The said town of Yarmouth shall have all the privileges and be subject to all the rules and liabilities named in an Act to incorporate the town of Weston, approved March seven, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

Same privilege and liability as town of Weston

Sec. 5. This Act shall be in force from and after its passage.
