

the hours of ten and eleven in the forenoon, and closed at four in the afternoon of said day; and at the close of the polls, the votes shall be counted and a true statement thereof proclaimed to the voters present by one of the Judges, and the Clerk shall make a true record thereof, and within five days thereafter he shall give notice to the persons so elected of their election; and it shall be the duty of said Town Council, at least ten days before each and every election, to give notice of the same by putting up notices at three of the most public places in said town.

Powers of
town officers

Sec. 4. The President and Trustees of said town are hereby created a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, to be known and designated by the name of the town of Acton, and shall possess all the rights and be subject to all the liabilities usually belonging to municipal corporations.

Sec. 5. This Act to take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CCLX.

An Act to locate and establish a State Road from St. Joseph in Stearns County, via Richmond to Long Prairie in Todd County.

SECTION 1. Appointment of Commissioners to lay out State Road.

2. Meeting of Commissioners, and draft of location of Road to be deposited with Register of Deeds.

3. Power of Commissioners to appoint substitutes.

4. Expenses of location of Road paid by the counties through which the road passes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Commissioners
appointed

SECTION 1. That Everette Abbott, Samuel M. Bruce, and Samuel Wakefield, be and are hereby appointed Commissioners to locate and mark a State Road, commencing at St.

Joseph in Stearns County, via Richmond to Long Prairie in Todd County.

Sec. 2. The Commissioners so appointed, shall meet at St. Joseph, on the second Monday of May, or at such other ^{Meeting of com- missioners} time as they may agree upon, and proceed to survey, locate and establish said road in accordance with Section first of this Act, and shall complete the same and file a plat of said road in the office of the Register of Deeds of each of the counties through which said road is located, within six months next after the date of the passage of this Act. The said ^{Draft of road to be deposited} Commissioners are hereby authorized and empowered to procure a competent surveyor at an expense of not more than three dollars per day; and one axo-man and two chain-men, at an expense of not more than one dollar and fifty cents per day each. The said plat, before being filed as aforesaid, shall be certified to by the surveyor and at least two of said Commissioners, which certificate shall be legal evidence of the location of said road.

Sec. 3. If either of the Commissioners shall, from any ^{Power to ap- point substi- tutes} cause be unable to perform the duties herein assigned him, it shall be the duty of the others to appoint a substitute.

Sec. 4. The expense incurred in the location and survey of said road shall be paid by the counties through which the ^{Expenses how paid} same may pass.

Sec. 5. This Act shall take effect from and after its pas- sage.
