

**Employ Sur-  
veyor**      **SEC. 3.** The said Commissioners shall have power, and by this act are authorized to employ a competent Surveyor, who shall be entitled to receive for his services the sum of three dollars per day, and two chainmen, who shall receive two dollars per day each, during the time actually employed in the survey of said Road.

**Expense**      **SEC. 4.** The expenses of survey and location of said Road shall be paid by the counties through which it passes, in proportion to the distance said Road passes through said counties.

**Appoint sub-  
stitute**      **SEC. 5.** A majority of said Commissioners shall have power to appoint a substitute in the event of the absence or refusal to act of either of said Commissioners.

**Per diem**      **SEC. 6.** Said Commissioners shall be entitled to receive each the sum of three dollars per day for their services, while actually employed in the location of said Road.

**Take effect**      **SEC. 7.** This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER XXIX.

### *An Act to provide for the construction of a State Road from Faribault to Wilton.*

- SECTION 1.** Board of Commissioners.  
 2. Meeting of Board. Appoint substitute.  
 3. Expenses to be paid by the several counties.  
 4. File plat of said road.  
 5. Take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That Charles Williams, Alonzo Barnum and E. J. Crandell, and the same be hereby appointed Commissioners, to locate and open out a State Road from Faribault, Rice County, on the nearest and most practicable route to Wilton, in Meeker County. Commissioners

SEC. 2. That said Commissioners shall meet as soon as convenient, after the passage of the Act, and at said meeting shall appoint the time when the location of said road shall be commenced and may adjourn from time to time as may be requisite. And in case either of the Commissioners above named neglect or refuse to act as such Commissioner, the other Commissioners may supply the vacancy by the appointment of some suitable person, who shall have the same authority as is by this Act conferred upon either of said Commissioners above named. Meeting  
\*Appoint substitute

SEC. 3. That each county through which the said road shall pass, shall pay the expenses incurred in the location of the same as aforesaid in proportion to the length of said road in each county respectively. Expense

SEC. 4. Said Commissioners shall file a plat of said road in the Register's office of the respective counties through which said road may run. File plat

SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. Take effect
