

CHAPTER LV.

An Act to Incorporate the town of Kandotta.

- SECTION 1. Boundaries of the Town.
 2. Trustees named—term of office.
 3. Power to enter Land under the Act of Congress.
 4. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That so much land as is contained in the town site of Kandotta, near Fairy Lake, in township one hundred and twenty-seven (127), and range thirty-four (34), be, and the same is hereby incorporated by the name of Kandotta, with all the powers, rights and privileges usually enjoyed by municipal corporations. ^{Boundaries of the town}

SEC. 2. That E. Whitefield, O. D. Ashley and Chas. Cook are hereby appointed Trustees of said town, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified, and the corporate name of said town organization shall be the "Town Council of Kandotta." ^{Trustees their term of office}

SEC. 3. That the Trustees of said town shall have power to enter so much land within the corporate limits of said town as can be entered under the provisions of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act for the relief of citizens of towns upon lands of the United States, under certain circumstances," approved May 23d, 1844. ^{Town site to be entered}

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
