An Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to Incorporate the Town of La Crescent.

SECTION 1. Change of Boundary lines in the Town of La Crescent.

2. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That Section one in the Act incorporating the Town of La Crescent, be amended so as to read as follows, viz: That Section ten (10), north half and the north half of Boundaries of the south half of fractional section eleven (11), east half of La Crescent the north-east quarter of section nine (9), south half of the south-west fractional quarter of section two (2), and all of Moore and Peterson's addition lying north of the south half of the south

half of section three (3), all in township one hundred and four (104), north of range four west, and lying in Houston County, State of Minnesota, be and the same is hereby created and declared to be an incorporated town by the name of La Crescent.

CHAPTER LXXXIV.

An Act to amend Section 19, of Chapter 18, of the Session Laws of the Extra Session of 1857.

SECTION 1. Amends Section 19, defining boundaries of town of Duluth, and naming first President and Town Council.

Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That Section 19 be amended so as to read: That fractional portion of Minnesota Point, lying at the northern extremity of the same, in township forty-eight and township fifty, north of range fourteen west, be and the same is hereby created a town corporate and politic, by the name and style of Duluth, and the corporate name of the town or-Boundaries of ganization shall be the "Town Council of the Town of Du-Inth." That William Nettleton is hereby appointed the first President, J. B. Culver, Recorder, and R. E. Jefferson, E. H. Rice and William Ord, Trustees; who shall hold their offices until their suscessors are elected and qualified, and said Town Council may fill or vacate such offices at pleasure.
