CHAPTER XXI.

An Act prohibiting the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors to Indians.

- SECTION 1. Penalty for selling intoxicating liquors to Indians.
 2. Justices of the Peace to have power to determine such cases.
 3. Indians to be competent witnesses in such cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Any person who shall sell, exchange, or give, barter or dispose of any intoxicating or spirituous liquors or wine to an Indian, whether within the Indian country or without the limits thereof and within this State, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail, not more than three months nor less than twenty days, or by fine not exceeding one hundred (100) dollars nor less than twenty-five (25) dollars, or by Penalty for selling liquor to Indians

both such imprisonment and fine; and every person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Justices to hear
and determine of-
fenses

SEC. 2. Justices of the Peace throughout the State shall have full and complete jurisdiction to hear, try, and determine all offenses committed under the provisions of this Act, within the limits of their proper county.

Indians compe-
tent witnesses

SEC. 3. Indians are hereby declared to be competent witnesses in cases arising under this Act.

CHAPTER XXII.

An Act proposing an amendment to Article four of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota:

- SECTION 1. Amendment limiting sessions of the Legislature.
2. Submission of amendment to electors—form of ballot—manner of conducting election.
3. When to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Sessions of Legis-
lature limited to
sixty days

SECTION 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of this State is hereby proposed for publication and approval or rejection by the people, in accordance with Section one (1) of Article fourteen (14) of the Constitution; that is to say, that there be added to Section one (1) of Article four (4) of the Constitution of the State, the following words:

“But no session shall exceed the term of sixty days.”
