

Orders on Treasurer.

the City Council. All orders drawn upon the Treasurer shall specify the purpose for which they were drawn, shall be payable to the person in whose favor they are drawn, or bearer, and all such orders shall be received in payment of any tax or assessment levied by authority of the City. No moneys shall be appropriated for any purpose whatever except such as are expressly authorized by this Act."

When Act takes effect.

SEC. 6. This Act shall take effect from and after the first day of May, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty.

CHAPTER XXX.

An Act to Incorporate the Town of Arlington.

- SECTION 1. Boundaries of the Town of Arlington.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Corporation limits.

SECTION 1. That so much land as is contained in the south-west quarter and the west half of the south-east quarter of section nine in township one hundred and thirteen north, of range twenty-seven west, be and the same is hereby created a town corporate by the name of Arlington, and shall have and enjoy all the powers, privileges and responsibilities usually enjoyed by municipal corporations.

Officers.

SEC. 2. That for the good order and government of said town, it shall be lawful and there shall be established a President, Recorder, and three Trustees, who shall constitute the town council of said town, and shall be known as "the Town Council of Arlington," and any three of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 3. James S. Perry as President, William S. Beatty as Recorder, and George Boty, John H. Stevens, and Thomas Vaughn, shall be known and are hereby constituted the town council of said town, who shall hold their respective offices for one year and until their successors shall be elected and qualified, and who shall have full power and authority to make and establish all needful rules and regulations for the government of the said town.

Names of Councilmen.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the President with the consent of the town council of said town corporate, to enter so much land within the corporate limits of said town as can be entered under the provisions of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act for the relief of citizens of towns upon the lands of the United States under certain circumstances," approved May twenty-third, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

Duty of President

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the town council as soon as the title to said lands shall be obtained pursuant to the third section of this act to ascertain the number of persons entitled legally or equitably to lots, or squares within said town and to deed under the hand of the President and seal of the corporation, to every such person entitled as aforesaid, *Provided*, that any person or persons to whom lots or squares shall be so deeded, shall previously have paid the sum of one dollar for each deed and acknowledgment so required to be made.

Duties of Council

SEC. 6. If any vacancy should occur in any of the offices of the town council aforesaid, a quorum of said town council duly assembled, shall at any time fill said vacancy.

Vacancy.

SEC. 7. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
