Joint Resolution of the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, Relating to Change of County Lines hitherto proposed.

Whereas, No provision of law has hitherto existed for the sufficient publication of the adoption, by the people of organized counties, of changes in the county lines, proposed since the adoption of the State Constitution,

Resolved, That the county auditor of each and every change of county county in the State, in which a vote has been or should proposed have been taken upon any question of division of county, or change of county lines, since the adoption of the Constitution of the State, is hereby required, before the first day of June next, to make and return to the office of the Secretary of State, a certified statement of the votes of his county upon each and every such question. And the Governor is hereby authorized to make procla-mation of such changes of county lines as have been adopted by the majority of the electors of the counties affected thereby.
