

CHAPTER XXII.

An Act to Establish and Define the Boundaries of Lincoln county.

- SECTION 1. Boundaries established and defined.
 2. County seat—where.
 3. Attached to fourth judicial district.
 4. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That so much territory as is embraced in the following boundaries be, and the same is hereby established as the county of Lincoln: Beginning at the northeast corner of town one hundred and seventeen, of range thirty-one; thence in a southerly direction, along the range line between ranges thirty and thirty-one to the southeast corner of town one hundred and fifteen, of range thirty-one; thence in a westerly direction, along the town line between towns one hundred and fourteen and one hundred and fifteen, to the southwest corner of town one hundred and fifteen of range thirty-five; thence in a northerly direction, along the range line between ranges thirty-five and thirty-six, to the north-west corner of town one hundred and sixteen of range thirty-five; thence in an easterly direction, along the town line between towns one hundred and sixteen, and one hundred and seventeen to the northeast corner of town one hundred and sixteen, of range thirty-three; thence in a northerly direction, along the range line between ranges thirty-two and thirty-three, to the north-west corner of town one hundred and seventeen, of range thirty-two; thence east to the place of beginning.

SEC. 2. The county seat of said county is hereby established at the town of Lowell.

SEC. 3. Said county shall be attached to the fourth judicial district for judicial purposes.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect on the proclamation by the Governor, of its adoption by a majority of the electors of the counties affected thereby, present and voting thereon at the next general election.
