CHAPTER LXX.

An Act to provide for the Removal of Obstructions from the Streets of Unincorporated Towns and Villages in this State.

SECTION 1. Powers of supervisors—expense of removing obstructions—how recovered.
2. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The supervisors of the several towns in this State in which any unincorporated village or town is situated, a plat of which is duly recorded, shall have the same power and authority to cause any and all obstructions lying or being in any street or alley of any unincorporated village or town within their respective town to be removed, that are conferred upon them in relation to any territorial, state, county or public road within their respective towns, by virtue of an act of the legislature, entitled "an act to provide for laying out, altering, discontinuing, working and repairing roads and bridges," approved March ninth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty; and may keep such streets and alleys open, and cause any obstructions placed thereon to be removed at the expense of the person causing the same, if he shall fail to remove the same upon reasonable notice, and the expense of such removal may be recovered in a civil ac-

tion against the person or persons causing such obstructions, in the name of the supervisors of such town, in any court having competent jurisdiction, the sum thus acquired to be paid to the town treasurer for the use of the town.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXI.

An Act Authorizing the Recording of Certificates of United States Land Officers.

SECTION 1. Certificate of any Register or Receiver of entry or purchase of any tract of land may be recorded in the office of register of deeds.

2. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the receiver's receipt or certificate of purchase of public lands, signed by the receiver, and the certificate of any register or receiver, of the entry or purchase of any tract or tracts of land by a military land warrant, shall be allowed to be recorded in the office of the register of deeds in the county in which the land described in such receipt or certificate is situated, and that the record of all certificates of any register or receiver of the entry or purchase of land heretofore made, is hereby declared legal and valid.

What may be recorded in the office of Register of Deeds

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
