

CHAPTER XC.

An Act to Authorize the Clerk of the District Court of the Sixth Judicial District, and County of McLeod to Transcribe the Records of his Office.

- SECTION 1. Clerk to procure new judgment book or books and docket—to transcribe what—such judgments, records and dockets to be as valid as the original records.
2. County commissioners to purchase necessary books—compensation of clerk.
3. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The clerk of the district court of the sixth judicial district, and county of McLeod is hereby authorized and required to procure, if necessary, a new judgment book or books, and judgment docket book, and such other books as may be required to carry out the provisions of this act, at the expense of the county of McLeod, and to transcribe all judgments and all entries in any judgment docket, and all the records of the said court into such new books to be provided, and the said judgment or judgments so transcribed, and the docket of the same, and the records transcribed in such new books shall be and remain as valid and of the same force and effect as the original records; and no judgment lien shall be affected or impaired thereby.

Duty of clerk—
what to be as valid as original records

SEC. 2. The county commissioners of McLeod county shall make provisions for the purchase of the books necessary to carry out the provisions of this act, and the clerk of said court, for transcribing the records of said court, as provided in this act, shall be entitled to receive ten cents per folio, to be paid out of the county treasury.

Who to purchase necessary books—compensation of clerk

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
