

## CHAPTER XVI.

*An Act appropriating money to cover deficiencies for the year 1862, and for other purposes therein named.***SECTION 1.** Appropriations to cover deficiencies for year 1862.

1. For defraying expenses of the appraisal and leasing of school lands.
2. For defraying expenses of printing for the several State departments.
3. For mileage of county treasurers.
4. For additional Legislative expenses.
5. To C. H. Mix, for stationery.
6. To Wm. B. Marshall, for printing 500 extra copies Governor's message.
7. To D. D. Merrill, for blank books and journals.
8. To D. D. Merrill, for stationery.
9. For rent of arsenal.
10. For salary of arsenal keeper.
11. For additional clerk hire in adjutant general's office.
12. To A. J. Hill, for services as enrolling clerk.
13. To Thomas Foster, for balance due as janitor of capitol.
14. To Owen Dowd, for additional compensation as janitor.
15. To Wm. Gruber, for repairs in Senate chamber and hall of House of Representatives.
16. To Wm. Gruber, for repairs in supreme court room.
17. To Oscar Malmros, for moneys paid on account of contingent expenses.
18. For additional salary of adjutant general.
19. To Minnesota Telegraph.
20. For incidental expenses of State prison for year 1861.
21. To T. Lund, for services as bailiff to supreme court.
22. For clerk hire of adjutant general and contingent expenses of State land office.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

**SECTION 1.** That the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated, out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to cover deficiencies for the year 1862, and for other purposes herein specified:

Appropriations to

*First*—For defraying the expense of the appraisal and leasing of the school lands, including the cost of surveys and advertising—two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$2,800.00.)

*Second*—For defraying the expense of printing and publishing for the several State departments for the year 1862—three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600.00.)

*Third*—For mileage for county treasurers traveling to and from St. Paul, to pay over State funds—seven hundred dollars (\$700.00.)

*Fourth*—For additional Legislative expenses of the

regular session for the year 1862—two hundred dollars (\$200.00.)

*Fifth*—To C. H. Mix, for stationery furnished the officers of the Senate, regular session, 1862—thirty-eight dollars (\$38.00.)

*Sixth*—To Wm. R. Marshall, for printing five hundred extra copies of the Governor's Message—thirty dollars (\$30.00.)

*Seventh*—To D. D. Merrill, for blank books and journals furnished the Senate and House of Representatives, procured by order of the Secretary of State—seventeen dollars and fifty cents (\$17.50.)

*Eighth*—To D. D. Merrill, for stationery for officers of the Senate—six dollars and eighty-five cents (\$6.85.)

*Ninth*—For rent of arsenal for the year 1862—three hundred dollars (\$300.00.)

*Tenth*—For salary of arsenal keeper—two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00.)

Appropriations

*Eleventh*—For additional clerk hire in the office of the adjutant general, until September, 1862—five hundred dollars (\$500.00.)

*Twelfth*—To A. J. Hill, for services as enrolling clerk of Senate, 1861—six dollars (\$6.00.)

*Thirteenth*—To Thomas Foster, for balance due him as janitor of the Capitol for 1861—seventeen dollars (\$17.00)

*Fourteenth*—To Owen Dowd, for additional compensation as janitor of the Capitol for 1862—fifty dollars (\$50.00.)

*Fifteenth*—To Wm. Gruber, for repairing and furnishing the Senate chamber and hall of Representatives for extra session—twenty-one dollars (\$21.00.)

*Sixteenth*—To Wm. Gruber, for repairs done in the supreme court room—fifteen dollars (\$15.00.)

*Seventeenth*—To Oscar Malmros, for moneys paid on account of contingent expenses for the office of adjutant general—eighty dollars and forty-eight cents (\$80.48.)

*Eighteenth*—For additional salary of the adjutant general—four hundred dollars (\$400.00.)

*Nineteenth*—To the Minnesota State Telegraph Company for use of telegraph for the State—nine hundred and fifty dollars (\$950.00.)

*Twentieth*—For incidental expenses of the State prison for the year 1861, salary of guards, and medical attend-

ance—four hundred and seventy-six dollars and twenty-two cents (\$476.22.)

*Twenty-first*—To T. Lund, for service as bailiff to supreme court—two dollars (\$2.00.)

*Twenty-second*—For clerk hire of adjutant general—five hundred dollars (\$500.00,) and for contingent expenses of the office of Commissioner of the State land office—one hundred dollars (\$100.00.)

## CHAPTER XVII.

### *An Act appropriating money for certain purposes.*

SECTION 1. Appropriations for purposes herein specified.

1. For a military contingent fund.
2. For an executive contingent fund.
3. To defray the expenses for the support of the insane.
4. To pay mileage and per diem of members and officers of the Legislature.
5. For payment of interest on State loan.

SECTION 2. Act, when to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the following purposes: Appropriations  
for purposes  
herein specified

*First*—For a military contingent fund, subject to the order of the Governor, State Auditor and Attorney General, to be used in case the public safety require—the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00.)

*Second*—For an executive contingent fund (for State purposes only) six hundred dollars (\$600.00.)

*Third*—To defray the expenses for the support of the insane, subject to the order of the Governor—two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00.)
