

Fourth—For payment of mileage and per diem of members and officers of the Legislature—eight hundred dollars (\$800.00.)

Fifth—For the payment of interest on State loan, authorized at this extra session of 1862—eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00.)

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XVIII.

An Act to appropriate money for certain purposes.

- SECTION 1.** Appropriations for defraying the expenses of the present Legislative session.
1. For payment of mileage and per diem of members and officers of the Legislature.
 2. To Wm. R. Marshal for printing laws and journals.
 3. For publication of laws in a newspaper.
 4. For payment of incidental printing.
 5. For payment of bills for stationery.
 6. For relief of sufferers from Indian depredations.
 7. For payment of medical board for examination of surgeons.
 8. For payment of printing for Superintendent of Public Instruction.
 9. For translation of Governor's Message.
 10. For payment of claims adjudged by State Board of Auditors.
 11. For postage and stationery for State Librarian.
- SECTION 2.** What items to be paid out of the proceeds of State Loan.
3. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to defray the expenses of the present legislative session:

First—For the payment of mileage and per diem of the members and officers of the Legislature—six thousand five hundred dollars—(\$6,500.00.)

Second—To Wm. R. Marshall, for printing and binding three hundred copies each of the journals of the Senate and House of Representatives, and for printing and binding five thousand copies of the laws of [the] present session—one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00.) *Provided*, That such sum as may be necessary shall be appropriated out of the above sum to defray the expense of preparing the journals for the printer, and indexing the same.

Third—For the publication of the laws in a newspaper—one hundred dollars (\$100.00.)

Fourth—For the payment of the incidental printing of the present Legislature—seven hundred dollars (\$700.00.)

Fifth—For the payment of bills for stationery furnished the secretary of the Senate and chief clerk of the House of Representatives for the present session—one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00.)

Appropriations

Sixth—For the payment of claims for subsistence, clothing and medical attendance for the relief of sufferers from Indian depredations, to be allowed by commissioners appointed for that purpose—twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00.)

Seventh—For the payment of the medical board for examination of surgeons, per order of the War Department—three hundred dollars (\$300.00.)

Eighth—For the payment for printing for superintendent of public instruction—twenty-nine dollars and seventy-three cents (\$29.73.)

Ninth—For the payment of the assignee of Eugene Burnand for translating and publishing 500 copies of the Governor's Message, February, 1862—fifty dollars (\$50.00.)

Tenth—For the payment of claims, adjusted and allowed by the State Board of Auditors, created by an act of the Legislature, passed at the extra session, 1862—seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00.)

Eleventh—For postage, stationery, and other incidental expenses in the office of the State Librarian—sixty-five dollars (\$65.00.)

SEC. 2. Items sixth and tenth shall be paid out of the proceeds of the State Loan.

What to be paid out of State loan

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
