are deaf mutes, as may pay for their maintenance and instruction a sum equal to the average expense for the support and instruction of the whole number of pupils under the charge of said Commissioners, which money shall be added to the fund herein appropriated, and expended by them in like manner.

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SEC. 5. The said Commissioners shall take vouchers To report to next for all moneys expended by them, and shall return the same with their report. They shall report to the Legislutre at its next session their transactions, with a detailed account of their expenditures under this act, together with such suggestions as may, in their judgment, tend to the promotion of the interest of the blind, and the deaf mutes of the State.

This act shall take effect and be in force from SEC. 6.

CHAPTER X.

An Act to Provide for the Apportionment of the School Fund, in March, 1863.

SECTION 1. When School Districts that have neglected to make annual report suthorized by law to report—when entitled to share of apportionment money.

2. When not to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the several School District Clerks, who neglected to make their annual reports on or before the 15th of October, 1862, are hereby authorized to make thorised to report such report to the County Auditor on or before the first - slee entities day of March, 1863, and the districts so making returns to apportunent shall share in the apportionment of the School Fund, to be made by the County Auditor in March, 1863.

This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XI.

An Act to provide for the publication and distribution of the Decisions and Regulations of the Executive Department upon the School and Tax Laws.

SECTION 1. State Auditor and Superintendent of Public Instruction shall cause to be published decisions of the school and revenue laws.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Auditor of State, and Superintendent of Public Instruction, as soon as practicable after the passage of this act, and as often Publication of thereafter, as they thall deem expedient, to cause to le on the school and published, the decisions of the Attorney General and the revenue laws rules and regulations of their several Departments upon the school and revenue laws, and to cause the same to be distributed to the Auditors of the several counties in this State, the expense of which publication shall be defrayed out of the fund appropriated for public printing.
