

the Extra Session Laws of 1862, entitled "an act to provide for the organization, equipment, and discipline of the military forces of the State," be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 6. The Adjutant General by and with the consent of the Commander-in-Chief, is authorized to appoint a Military Storekeeper and Armorer, who shall hold such office during the pleasure of the Adjutant General, and whose duty it shall be to preserve and keep in order, the arms and other public property of the State, in the possession of the Adjutant General, and shall receive in full compensation for his services in time of war, four hundred dollars per year: and in time of peace such sum as may be agreed upon by the Adjutant General, approved by the Governor, not to exceed the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per year.

CHAPTER XXI.

An Act to amend Section One, of Title Four, of Chapter Four, of the General Laws, passed at the Extra Session of the Legislature, in the year 1862, entitled "an act to provide for the Organization, Equipment, and Discipline of the Military Forces of the State."

- SECTION 1. Organization of the militia into divisions, brigades, &c., to conform to the laws of the United States.
2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That Section 1, of Title 4, of Chapter 4, of the General Laws passed at the Extra Session, by the Legislature, in the year 1862, and approved September

29th, 1862, be and the same is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

Sec. 1. The organization of the militia in divisions, brigades, regiments, battallions, squadrons, troops, and companies, shall be conformed to the provisions of the laws of the United States, so far as the same may be practicable. Organization of the militia to conform to the laws of the U. S.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, February 19, 1863.

CHAPTER XXII.

An Act to amend an act entitled "An act to regulate the Traffic in Logs and Lumber," passed August 9th, 1858.

- SECTION 1. Location of the offices of Surveyors of Logs and Lumber, in the first, second, third, and fourth districts.
 2. Repeal of acts inconsistent with this act.
 3. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That Section 4, of Chapter 1, be amended so as to read as follows: The Surveyor of the first district shall keep his office at the city of Stillwater; of the second district at the Falls of St. Anthony; and of the third district at the city of Red Wing; and of the fourth district at the city of St. Cloud. Location of the offices of Surveyors of Logs and Lumber.

Sec. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed. Repeal of acts inconsistent with this act

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, February 3, 1863.
