

Taxes to be legal
and valid—duty
of treasurer

SEC. 2. That said tax when extended on or against the real estate in said district shall be legal and valid, and the County Treasurer of said county shall have the same power to collect said tax by distress and sale as is now possessed by him in collecting county taxes.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, March 6, 1863.

CHAPTER XLII.

An Act to Repeal Chapter 44 of the Special Laws of 1862, relating to Free Schools in Minneapolis, and to confirm the Proceedings of the Board of Education of Minneapolis, and authorizing the filling of vacancies in said Board.

- SECTION 1. Repeal of former act.
2. Confirmation of proceedings of Board of Education.
3. Vacancy in Board of Education, how filled.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Repeal of former
act

SECTION 1. An act entitled "an act to amend an act in relation to free schools in the town of Minneapolis, approved May 23, 1857," which act was approved March 6th, 1862, is hereby repealed.

Proceedings of
Board of Equal-
ization confirmed

SEC. 2. The proceedings of the Board of Education of Minneapolis, during the year 1862, in filling vacancies in the said Board, are hereby confirmed.

Vacancy how
filled

SEC. 3. In case of a vacancy in the Board of Education of Minneapolis, it shall be filled until the next annual election, by the remaining members of the Board, when, if the vacancy occurs in the first year of the term

of said office, the electors shall choose another to fill the remainder of said term.

Approved, March 3, 1863.

CHAPTER XLIII.

An Act to authorize School District number Two, of Scott County, to Levy a Tax to purchase a site for a School House, and to build a School House.

SECTION 1. Power of legal voters of said district.
2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The legal voters of school district number two, of Scott county, when lawfully assembled, not less than five being present, shall have power by a majority of the votes of those present, to vote an amount of money to be raised by a tax on the taxable property of said district, to purchase a site for a school house and to build a school house, to an amount not exceeding the sum of five hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
