

the unbuilt portion of the said branch road, shall be forfeited to the State.

SEC. 2. The said Saint Paul and Pacific Railroad Company may consolidate the whole or any portion of its said branch road and property, and franchises of any other Railroad Company, or any portion thereof, upon such terms and conditions, as said companies, or a majority of the stockholders thereof, respectively, may agree; *May consolidate said branch road*  
*Provided*, That said branch road shall not be affected by or subject to any liens, judgments, deed of trust or mortgage, created upon or growing out of any agreements, liabilities, or transactions connected with any other portion of said St. Paul and Pacific Railroad.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Approved, March 6, 1863.

## CHAPTER V.

### *An Act to Extend the Time for the Grading and Completion of the Lake Superior and Mississippi Railroad.*

SECTION 1. When said road to be completed.  
 2. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That the Lake Superior and Mississippi Railroad Company, as organized under the act entitled "An act to amend an act to incorporate the Nebraska and Lake Superior Railroad Company, approved March 8th, A. D. 1861, shall be entitled to have the time for the grading, construction and completion of said road and its branches extended as follows, to wit: If said company

shall, within three years from the time of the passage of this act, grade at least twenty miles of their said road from Lake Superior, and within ten years from said last named time, construct and complete a first class railroad from Lake Superior to the Mississippi River, with the necessary cars and engines running thereon; then, and in that case, said company shall be entitled to the lands in said act granted for said line and its branches, as provided in section eighteen (18) of said act, as soon and as fast as each and every twenty miles of said road shall be completed, subject to the provisions and conditions of said act, and with all the rights, property, privileges and franchises in said act granted.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
