

be not made within thirty days after the time fixed by law for the county treasurer to pay over to the town treasurer the money in his hands belonging to such town, levied for the purpose of paying such judgment, next after the rendition of such judgment, then, and in that event, execution may be issued on such judgment; *Provided*, That if, at the time of the rendition of such judgment, there shall be sufficient funds belonging to the town, in the treasury, it shall be the duty of the treasurer to pay the same upon application being made to him by the person in whose favor such judgment was rendered, his agent or attorney.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER LXIV.

### *An Act to provide for the relief of the sick and disabled soldiers belonging to Minnesota.*

- SECTION 1. Appropriation for the relief of sick and disabled soldiers belonging to Minnesota.
2. Governor authorized to appoint Commissioners to visit hospitals—for what purpose.
  3. In what cases such aid to be administered.
  4. Commissioners to keep a detailed and correct account of all moneys which they may pay out—to make report—to whom.
  5. Subscribe oath for faithful performance of duties—per diem and mileage.
  6. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated the sum of five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the relief of the sick and disabled soldiers belonging to Minnesota in the different hospitals where they may be found.

Appropriation for the relief of sick and disabled soldiers

SEC. 2. The Governor is hereby authorized to appoint such commissioners as he may deem proper for carrying out the provisions of this act, whose duty it shall be to visit the hospitals used by the army, for the sick and disabled soldiers of our regiments, and supply such sick and disabled soldiers with food and medical assistance, and necessary aid to return to their homes; and the money so appropriated shall be paid by the Auditor of the State on the certificate of the Governor.

Who to appoint commissioner to visit hospitals—for what purpose

SEC. 3. That no other aid than that accruing under the class mentioned in section one of this act, shall be allowed by said authorities.

In what case such aid to be administered

SEC. 4. The authorities mentioned in section two of this act, shall keep a detailed and correct account of all moneys which they may pay out, and at least ten days prior to the commencement of the next regular session of the Legislature, they shall prepare and deposit with the Governor a full and concise report of all moneys thus paid, according to the provisions of this act.

Commissioners to keep account of all moneys paid out—to make report—when

SEC. 5. That before entering upon the discharge of their duties, said commissioners shall take and subscribe an oath that they will perform the duties of the office faithfully and honestly, to the best of their judgment and ability, and they shall receive as a compensation for their services, the sum of three dollars per day for each day they are actually engaged in the discharge of their duties, and five cents for each mile necessarily traveled, which shall be in full for said services and their expenses.

Subscribe oath for faithful performance of duty—per diem and mileage

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
