

the Union by the Secretary, and the balance deposited with the State Librarian, but no vote or resolution of the Legislature shall entitle the members of either house to a copy of said two hundred volumes.

Repeal of inconsistent acts.

SEC. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XXXV.

February 6, 1865.

An Act for the improvement of navigation on the Minnesota River.

- SECTION 1. Amount of appropriation for the improvement of the Minnesota River.
2. Governor to appoint Commissioners—duty of Commissioners.
 3. Commissioners may employ assistance.
 4. Commissioners to keep a detailed and correct account of expenses.
 5. To take and subscribe an oath for faithful performance of duties—compensation of Commissioners and assistants.
 6. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Amount of appropriation for the improvement of the Minnesota River.

SECTION 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of three thousand dollars, or so much as may be necessary, under the direction of the Governor, in causing to be cut-off all snags and logs which may be found in the Minnesota River from the rapids in Carver county, to New Ulm in Brown county.

Governor to appoint Commissioners—duty of Commissioners.

SEC. 2. The Governor is hereby authorized to appoint such commissioners as he may deem proper, for the carrying out of the provisions of this act, whose duty it shall be to proceed immediately after their ap-

pointment, to discharge the duties provided for herein, at such points on the river as the Governor may designate.

SEC. 3. The commissioners appointed by this act, are hereby authorized to employ in discharge of the duties provided for in this act, such ax-men as may be necessary to carry out the provisions herein. May employ assistance.

SEC. 4. The authorities mentioned in section two of this act, shall keep a detailed and correct account of all expenses which may occur in the discharge of the duties provided for in this act, and deposit the same with the Governor immediately after the completion of the same. To keep a detailed and correct account of expenses.

SEC. 5. That before entering upon the discharge of their duties, said commissioners shall take and subscribe an oath that they will perform the duties of their office faithfully and honestly, to the best of their judgment and ability, and said commissioners shall receive as compensation for the services performed by them in discharge of the duties provided for in this act, the sum of three dollars per day, which shall be in full as their compensation for each day they are actually engaged in the discharge of said duties. And such ax-men as may be employed, shall receive as compensation for their services, a sum not exceeding two dollars and fifty cents per day. To take an oath for faithful performance of duties—compensation.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.
