

riated to the State Prison, Insane Asylum, Institution for the education of the Deaf and Dumb at Faribault, and three Normal Schools, under the provisions of an act entitled "an act to appropriate swamp lands to certain educational and charitable institutions therein named, and for the purpose of erecting a State Prison," approved February thirteen, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, proceed to select and set apart the remainder of the swamp lands not heretofore otherwise appropriated for the erection and support of the Asylum created and established in and by this act.

SEC. 5. All lands so selected and set apart by the commissioner of the State land office, shall from and after such selection be deemed to be irrevocably dedicated to the use of said Asylum, and shall vest in the board of directors in and by this act created in trust for the uses and purposes of said institution.

When said lands to be deemed irrevocably dedicated to said Asylum.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER IV.

### *An Act to provide for the Relief of the Sick and Disabled Soldiers belonging to Minnesota.*

March 2, 1865.

- SECTION 1. Appropriation for the relief of sick and disabled soldiers belonging to Minnesota where they may be found.
2. Governor authorized to appoint Commissioners to visit hospitals—for what purpose—how money to be appropriated.
  3. In what cases such aid to be administered.
  4. Commissioners to keep a correct and detailed account of all moneys which they may pay out—to make report—to whom.
  5. Subscribe oath for faithful performance of duties—per diem and mileage.
  6. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated the

Appropriation for the relief of sick and disabled soldiers.

sum of three thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the relief of the sick and disabled soldiers belonging to Minnesota, in the different camps and hospitals where they may be found.

Governor to appoint Commissioners—for what purpose—how money to be appropriated.

SEC. 2. The Governor is hereby authorized to appoint such commissioners as he may deem proper for carrying out the provisions of this act, whose duty it shall be to visit the hospitals used by the army, for the sick and disabled soldiers [of our regiments, and supply such sick and disabled soldiers] with food and medical assistance, and necessary aid to return to their homes; and the money so appropriated shall be paid by the Auditor of the State on the certificate of the Governor.

In what cases aid to be administered.

SEC. 3. That no other aid than that accruing under the class mentioned in section one of this act, shall be allowed by said authorities.

To keep record of money paid out—to make report—to whom.

SEC. 4. The authorities mentioned in section two of this act, shall keep a detailed and correct account of all moneys which they may pay out, and at least ten days prior to the commencement of the next regular session of the Legislature, they shall prepare and deposit with the Governor a full and concise report of all moneys thus paid, according to the provisions of this act.

Take oath for faithful performance of duty—per diem and mileage.

SEC. 5. That before entering upon the discharge of their duties, said commissioners shall take and subscribe an oath that they will perform the duties of the office faithfully and honestly, to the best of their judgment and ability, and they shall receive as a compensation for their services, the sum of three dollars per day for each day they are actually engaged in the discharge of their duties, and five cents for each mile necessarily traveled, which shall be in full for said services and their expenses.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
