

CHAPTER XXXVIII.

*An Act to authorize the commissioners of the county of Dodge to issue bonds.* February 10, 1868.

- SECTION 1.** County Commissioners authorized to issue bonds—for what purpose.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

**SECTION 1.** The county commissioners, or a majority of them, of the county of Dodge, are hereby authorized to issue bonds for the purpose of erecting a building for the several county offices of said county, and for a fire proof vault to contain the records of said county, and for a suitable and convenient room for holding courts, in a sum not exceeding eight thousand dollars, in such denominations as the county commissioners, or a majority of them, of said county of Dodge shall determine, and such building, as aforesaid, shall be built at the present county seat of the said county of Dodge. Authorized to issue bonds—for what purpose.

**SEC. 2.** Such bonds may bear interest at a rate not exceeding ten per cent. per annum, payable annually, and the principal payable as follows: one-third in two years, and one-third in three years, and one-third in four years from the date of said bonds. At what rate of interest—when interest payable—when principal payable.

**SEC. 3.** The proper authorities of said county shall annually include in the general tax an amount sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as may be so issued, and when any principal is about to become due, a sufficient amount to pay such principal sum. How principal and interest paid.

**SEC. 4.** The bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall be signed by the chairman of the board of county commissioners of said county, and countersigned and sealed by the auditor of said county. The By whom bonds to be signed.

said county auditor shall keep a record of all bonds issued under the provisions of this act.

Who to negotiate  
bonds.

SEC. 5. The said board of county commissioners, or a majority of them, shall have authority to negotiate said bonds as in their judgment shall be best for the interest of said county, and the speedy erection of said building.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER XXXIX.

March 1, 1865.

*An Act to enable certain towns in Fillmore county to raise a special tax to build a bridge across Root river at Rushford, in said county.*

- SECTION 1. How funds to be raised for the purpose of bridging Root river.  
 2. How election to be conducted.  
 3. Duty of County Auditor in case of a majority in favor.  
 4. What to constitute a board of commissioners—duty of.  
 5. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

Funds for bridging

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the towns of Rushford, Norway, Holt, Amherst and Canton, of the county of Fillmore, at their next annual town meeting, to determine by a vote for or against the assessing of a tax of six mills on the dollar upon all the taxable property in each of said towns for the purpose of building a bridge over Root river at Rushford, in said county.

SEC. 2. The ballots shall be printed or written, or partly printed and partly written, as follows : "For the Rushford bridge tax," or "Against the Rushford bridge tax." The judges of elections in the several towns
