

that the same are correct transcripts of the original rolls on file in the office of said Secretary.

SEC. 4. Said commissioner shall receive for the services contemplated by this act the sum of \$1,000, and his necessary expenses while absent from his place of residence in the performance of the duties of his office. Salary of Commissioner.

SEC. 5. In case of death, resignation, or inability to act of said editor, the Governor shall appoint an editor of said statutes, who shall perform the duties, and receive the compensation, herein provided for, or a proportionate part thereof. In certain cases Governor may appoint.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XVIII.

An Act Relating to the Filing and Effects of certain Affidavits. February 28, 1866

SECTION 1. Affidavits to be received as evidence on certain conditions.

2. Proceedings not to be deemed invalid because of not filing.

3. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That in all cases where the affidavits authorized by the provisions of sections sixty and sixty-one of chapter eighty-four of the compiled statutes, have been heretofore filed, or shall be hereafter filed as therein provided, within one year after this act shall become a law, such affidavits, or duly certified copies thereof, shall be received in evidence in the Provides for receiving affidavits in certain conditions.

same manner and with the same effect as if the same had been filed within the time in said sections specified.

Failure to file
not to render in-
valid.

SEC. 2. No proceedings in which such affidavits have been heretofore received shall be deemed invalid by reason of the failure to file the same within the time prescribed by said section. *Provided*, that nothing herein contained shall be held to take away or affect any vested rights of any person or persons not parties to such proceedings.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XIX.

February 12, 1866 *An Act to amend an act entitled "An act fixing the time of holding terms of the District Courts in the Third Judicial District," approved Feb. 23, 1865. being Chapter LXXIII of the Session Laws of 1865.*

SECTION 1. Amends section 1 of Chapter LXXIII of Session Laws of 1865.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Amends Chapter

SECTION 1. That section one of chapter LXXIII of the session laws of 1865, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SEC. 1. The times of holding general terms of the district court in the third judicial district shall be as follows:

In Olmsted county, on the fourth Monday of April and the first Monday of October in each year.

In Winona county, on the fourth Monday of March and the second Monday of September of each year.
