

## CHAPTER XXXIX.

*An Act Providing for the Service of Notices in Civil Actions in certain cases.* February 28, 1866

SECTION 1. Provides how notices may be served in case of death or absence of attorney for a party in an action.

2. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. Whenever, by reason of death or otherwise, the attorney for a party to an action ceases to act as such, and said party is absent from and has no known place of residence within the State, service of notice requiring said party to appoint another attorney, or to appear in person in such action, may be made upon said party by filing the same in such action, with the clerk of the court in which the action is pending, and in case such party shall neither appoint an attorney nor appear in person therein within thirty days, he shall not be entitled to notice of any subsequent proceedings in such action.

In case of death or absence of party how notice may be served.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
