

## CHAPTER XXXIV.

*An Act to protect the growing of hedges.*

March 7, 1867

SECTION 1.—Rights of persons planting trees, &c.  
 2.—When act shall take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That any person who may plant a close hedge upon his property, along the line of any road or street, which is not less than sixty feet wide, shall have the right to build and maintain a temporary fence along the side of such road or street, six feet or less from the line thereof, for the period of five years from the time of planting such hedge, for the purpose only of protecting the growing of such hedge.

Right of person planting.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved March 7, 1867.

## CHAPTER XXXV.

*An Act to protect the sheep growing interests of Minnesota.*

March 7, 1867

SECTION 1.—Dogs may be killed in certain cases.  
 2.—When act shall take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. It is lawful for any person to kill, or

**Dogs to be killed** cause to be killed any dog or dogs which have been or shall be found injuring, fretting or killing any lambs or sheep within this state.

**SEC. 2.** That this act shall take effect and remain in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER XXXVI.

### *An Act providing for the payment of bounties for the destruction of wolves.*

**SECTION 1.**—Reward for killing wolves.

2.—Persons claiming bounty, how to proceed to recover.

3.—Duty of justice of peace in reference to bounty.

4.—Certificate and oath to be filled with county auditor.

5.—Duty of county auditor.

6.—Duty of state treasurer.

7.—Fees of justice of peace.

8.—Repeals chapter 28, session laws of 1866.

9.—When act shall take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

**Bounty:**

**SECTION 1.** That any person who shall kill any wolf or wolves within any organized county in this state, shall be entitled to receive for each wolf so killed a bounty or reward of ten dollars.

**Claiming bounty**

**SEC. 2.** That any person claiming such bounty or reward, shall produce the head of the wolf or wolves so killed, with the ears and scalp entire, within twenty days after such wolf or wolves have been killed, to a justice of the peace of the county within which such
