CHAPTER LXXIX.

An Act to cede to the United States, jurisdiction over such territory in the city of Saint Paul, Minnesota, as may be selected by the general government as a site for a custom-house and post-office. February 9, 1867

- SECTION 1.—City of St. Paul cedes jurisdiction over territory required for federal purposes.
- 2.—Boundary map of territory to be made out and filed in office of secretary of state.
 - 3.—Conditions of cession set forth.
 - 4.—When act shall take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That jurisdiction is hereby ceded to the United States over so much land as may be necessary and appurtenant to a site for the erection, construction and maintenance of a United States custom-house and post-office in the city of Saint Paul, state of Minnesota, not to exceed ten acres, the same to be selected by an authorized agent of the United States, and the selection to be approved by the governor. Jurisdiction ceded

SEC. 2. That upon such selection a map of the territory selected, definitely showing the boundaries thereof, with the approval of the governor, required in section one of this act, endorsed thereon, shall be filed in the office of the secretary of state of the state of Minnesota, and by him recorded. Map to be filed

SEC. 3. The cession of jurisdiction aforesaid is granted upon the following express conditions and re- Conditions of cession

restrictions, to-wit: The state of Minnesota shall have and hereby does retain a concurrent jurisdiction with the United States in and over the tract aforesaid, so far as that all civil and such criminal process as may issue under authority of this state against any person or persons charged with crimes committed without the bounds of said tract, may be served and executed thereon in the same manner and to the same extent as though the said cession of jurisdiction had not been made.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXX.

March 7, 1867 *An Act to exempt the earnings of minor children from liability to legal process.*

SECTION 1.—Exempts earnings of minor children from legal process.

2.—When act shall take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The earnings of any minor child of any debtor within this state, or the proceeds thereof, shall not be liable to attachment, garnishment, or sale on any final process of a court, in any action against such debtor, by reason of any debt or liability of such debtor not contracted for the especial benefit of such minor child.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
