D. 1856, in book "A" of church records, on page 47, under the name of the "Jackson Street Church," be, and the same is hereby changed to "The Jackson Street Methodist Episcopal Church."

Change of Name

Sec. 2. That the present trustees of the society incorporated as aforesaid, and their successors to be appointed according to the rules and discipline of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America, shall be and continue such body corporate, by the name last aforesaid, with all the rights, powers and privileges of other religious corporations constituted under the general laws of this state; and the present church and parsonage, property of said corporation, shall be and remain the property of said corporation, under its last aforesaid name, without any prejudice from any misnomer of the said corporation in the deeds or instruments under which the same is now held.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

An act to change the names of certain persons therein named. March 7 1867

SECTION 1—Change of name of Hattie L. Beers.

2—Changes name of Laura A. Beers.

3—Changes name of Florence J. Burnap.

4—When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Change of Name
of Hattie L. Beers

SECTION 1. That the name of Hattie L. Beers, an orphan child, be changed to that of Hattie L. Evans, and that she be declared to be the legally adopted daughter of Charles E. Evans and Harriet D. Evans, of the town of Forestville, in the county of Fillmore, and State of Minnesota, and that she shall enjoy all the rights, privileges, and inheritances, and be subject to all the obligations and duties, the same as if she had been the legitimate daughter of the said Charles E. Evans, and Harriet D. Evans, born in lawful wedlock.

Laura A. Beers

SEC. 2. That the name of Laura A. Beers, an orphan child be changed to that of Laura A. King, and that she be declared to be the lawfully adopted daughter of Jephtha King and Elizabeth King, of the town of Carimona, in the county of Fillmore, and State of Minnesota, and that she shall enjoy all the rights, privileges and inheritances, and be subject to all the obligations and duties, the same as if she had been the legitimate daughter of the said Jephtha King and Elizabeth King, born in lawful wedlock.

Florence J. Burnap

SEC. 3. That the name of Florence J. Burnap, an orphan child, be changed to that of Florence A. Colburn, and that she be declared to be the legally adopted daughter of Joseph R. Colburn and Ruth Colburn, of Carimona, in the county of Fillmore, and state of Minnesota.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
