

CHAPTER LXXVIII.

An Act to locate and establish the county seat of Jackson county. February 8, 1867

SECTION 1.—Locates county seat.

2.—When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the county seat of Jackson county be and the same is hereby located and established at the town of Jackson, situated on the south-west quarter of section number twenty-four (24), in township one hundred and two (102) north, of range thirty-five (35) west. Locates county seat

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXIX.

An Act to authorize the county commissioners of McLeod county to issue bonds for the purpose of erecting county buildings. March 9, 1867

SECTION 1.—Authorizes county commissioners to issue bonds for erecting county buildings

2.—Regulates rate of interest and time when payable.

3.—Proper authorities may levy tax.

4.—How bonds to be signed.

5.—When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Authorized to issue bonds

SECTION 1. That the county commissioners of the county of McLeod are hereby authorized to issue bonds of said county for the purpose of erecting county buildings, in a sum not exceeding eight thousand dollars, in such denominations as said commissioners shall determine.

Rate of interest

SEC. 2. Such bonds may bear interest not exceeding ten per cent. per annum, payable annually, and the principal shall be payable in not less than three nor more than ten years.

May levy tax

SEC. 3. The proper authorities of said county shall annually levy and include in the general tax, and in addition thereto, an amount sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds so issued, and when any part of the principal is about to become due, a sufficient amount to pay such principal.

Bonds—how signed—duty of auditor

SEC. 4. The bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall be signed by the said county commissioners and countersigned by the auditor of said county, and the said auditor shall keep a record of all bonds issued under the provisions of this act, giving numbers, dates and amounts, to whom issued and when payable.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage; but no bonds shall be issued in pursuance hereof, until after a majority of the legal voters of said county, voting on this proposition, shall have ratified and adopted the provisions hereof as follows: At the next general election in and for said county the electors voting in favor of the adoption of the provisions of this act shall vote by written or printed ballot as follows: "For issuing bonds to build county buildings," those against the same by written or printed ballots as follows: "Against issuing bonds to build county buildings." Said ballots shall be received, counted, certified and returned in the same manner as the votes for county officers, and shall be canvassed in the same manner by the board of canvassers of said county, and the said board of canvassers shall declare the result by certificate under their hands.
