

annually, in addition to all other county taxes, an amount sufficient to pay the interest and principal of such bonds, which shall from time to time become due; and shall cause the same to be collected as other taxes are collected, and apply the same accordingly.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XCV.

March 7, 1867 *An Act for the removal of the county seat of Wabashaw county from Wabashaw to Lake City.*

- SECTION 1.—Proposes removal of county seat.
 2.—Proposal to be submitted to voters.
 3.—Ballots, how prepared.
 4.—How received and counted.
 5.—Duty of canvassing board.
 6.—Citizens may donate money.
 7.—When act shall take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Removal of county seat

SECTION 1. The county seat of Wabashaw county is removed from Wabashaw to Lake City, subject to the proviso contained in section seven (7) of this act.

Question to be voted on

SEC. 2. At the time of the giving of the notice of the next general election, it shall be the duty of the officers in said county required by law to give notice of such election, to give notice in like manner, that at said election the question will be submitted to the electors of said county, as to whether this law shall take effect and be adopted by them: *Provided*, That a refusal or neglect to give such notice shall not

invalidate any election that may be held by virtue of this act.

SEC. 3. At said election, the electors of said county, in favor of the adoption of this law, shall have distinctly written or printed, or partly written and partly printed, on their ballots, "for removal of county seat to Lake City;" those opposed to such adoption the words "against removal of county seat."

Ballots—how prepared

SEC. 4. Such ballots shall be received and canvassed at the same time, in the same manner, and returned to the same officer, by the judges of election, as ballots for county officers.

How canvassed

SEC. 5. The county canvassing board of said county, to whom the returns of election are made, shall canvass the returns upon said question, in the same manner and at the same time as returns for county officers, and the abstract thereof shall be made on one sheet, and signed and certified in the same manner as in the case of the abstract for votes for said officers, and shall be deposited in the county auditor's office immediately thereafter, and a copy thereof, duly certified by the auditor, forwarded by him to the secretary of state, and the governor shall thereupon forthwith, if this law is adopted, make proclamation to that effect, as provided by law in such case.

Duty of canvassing board

SEC. 6. It shall be lawful for any citizen or citizens of said county to deposit any sum of money or bonds with the county treasurer, which they may propose to donate for the erection of public buildings at Lake City aforesaid.

Citizens may donate money

SEC. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force after its submission to the electors of said county at the next general election after the passage hereof, and its adoption by a majority of such electors voting thereon, and in case the same is adopted, all officers who are required to hold their offices at the county seat, shall, within thirty days of such adoption, move to and hold their offices at Lake City aforesaid.
