

CHAPTER XCVI.

March 4, 1867

An Act for the removal of the county seat of Wright county from Monticello to the village of Buffalo.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*Removal of
county seat

SECTION 1. The county seat of Wright county is removed from Monticello to the village of Buffalo in said county, subject to the provisions of section six of this act.

To be voted on

SEC. 2. At the time of the giving of the notice of the next general election it shall be the duty of the officers in said county, required by law to give notice of such election, to give notice in like manner that at said election the question will be submitted to the electors of said county as to whether this law shall take effect and be adopted by them.

Ballots, how
prepared

SEC. 3. At said election the electors of said county in favor of the adoption of this law, shall have distinctly written or printed, or partly written and partly printed on their ballots, "For removal of county seat to the village of Buffalo," those opposed to said adoption shall evince their opposition in the same manner by the words "Against the removal of county seat."

Ballots—how re-
ceived

SEC. 4. Such ballots shall be received and canvassed at the same time, in the same manner, and returned to the same officers by the judges of election as ballots for county officers.

Duty of canvass-
ing board

SEC. 5. The county canvassing board of said county shall canvass the returns upon the said question in the same manner and at the same time, as returns for county officers, and the abstract thereof shall be made

on one sheet, and signed and certified in the same manner as in the case of the abstract of votes for said officers, and shall be deposited in the county auditor's office immediately thereafter, and a copy thereof, duly certified by the auditor, forwarded by him to the secretary of State, and the governor shall thereupon, forthwith, if this law is adopted, make proclamation to that effect in such manner as he shall deem advisable.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force after its submission to the electors of said county at the next general election after the passage hereof, and its adoption by a majority of such electors, and in case the same is adopted, all officers who are required to hold their offices at the county seat, shall, within three months after such proclamation by the governor, move to, and hold their offices at the said village of Buffalo.

CHAPTER XCVII.

March 7, 1867

An Act to authorize the county commissioners of Wright county to issue bonds for the purpose of erecting county buildings.
