

CHAPTER XXXIX.

An Act prescribing the per diem compensation of the Attorney General for actual attendance upon Courts.

March 6, 1868.

- SECTION 1. Per diem and compensation allowed Attorney General for attendance upon Courts.
2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The per diem compensation hereafter to be allowed and paid to the attorney general for attendance as such upon courts shall be ten dollars for each and every day of such actual and necessary attendance.

Per diem and compensation.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XL.

An Act to amend section forty, title five, of chapter six, of the General Statutes, relating to the duties of the Attorney General.

March 6, 1868.

- SECTION 1. Amendment to Section 40, Title 5, Chapter 6, of the General Statutes. Attorney General required to give legal advice when requested by the several Departments of State.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Section forty, of title five, of chapter six,

of the general statutes of the state of Minnesota, is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

Required to give
legal advice.

Sec. 40. He shall, when required, give legal advice to the governor, the secretary, auditor and treasurer of state, the warden and directors of the penitentiary, and the state superintendent of public instruction, and directors of benevolent institutions, in all matters relating to their official business, and shall give his written opinion upon any question of law to either house of the legislature when required.

CHAPTER XLI.

February 27 1868

An Act to define the duties of Surveyor General of the First District of Minnesota.

- SECTION 1. To keep an alphabetical list of all log marks recorded in his office—statement, what to contain.
2. Deputies to be appointed on recommendation of Board of Trade of Stillwater—where deputies to reside.
 3. Surveyor General to cause all rafts, brills, &c., to be scaled before passing out of Lake St. Croix—also all logs in side booms for sawing or other use—all logs scaled to be entered on the books in their proper place.
 4. Fees for scaling logs to be paid by the party for whom the logs are scaled.
 5. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

To keep record
of log marks.

SECTION 1. The surveyor general of the first district shall keep an alphabetical list of all the log marks, recorded in his office, and opposite each mark a statement of First. The book and page in which the mark is recorded.

Second. Date of record.

Third. By whom cut.
