*Joint Resolution.*March 5, 1868.

Whereas, That by an act, entitled "An Act to establish and protect National Cemeteries, approved February twenty-second, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven," congress has adopted an uniform system for the management and care of all the Soldier's National Cemeteries throughout the United States, and made provisions for their maintenance, therefore be it

Resolved, by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That we respectfully request of and recommend to the legislature of the state of Maryland the passage of an act empowering the board of trustees having charge of the Antietam National Cemetery at Sharpsburg, Md., to transfer all the *right, title, interest and care* of said Antietam National Cemetery to the general government upon the completion of the same.

Joint resolution relating to the New Ulm mill claims.

Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Relating to the
New Ulm Mill
claims.

That the senators and representatives in congress from Minnesota are hereby requested to use their efforts and influence to procure the passage of a law authorizing and directing the payment of the New Ulm mill claims, the said claims being for labor done and materials furnished in building a mill at New Ulm, in the autumn, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, pursuant to an order of General Pope, commanding the department or district of Minnesota at that time.

Resolved, That the Governor be requested to forward a copy of this resolution to each senator and representative from Minnesota in congress, at Washington, D. C.
