

compute and fix upon the cost of building said bridge, and make a report of such cost to the state auditor, any two of said committee may act in the premises.

SEC. 4. That upon receipt of said report by the state auditor, he shall, upon the demand of the county treasurer of said Brown county, draw his order or orders in favor of said county treasurer on the state treasurer for moneys belonging to said fund, to the amount of one-half of the cost of the building of said bridge as reported by said committee, in case the entire cost shall not exceed ten thousand dollars; but if such entire cost shall exceed ten thousand dollars; then such orders shall only be drawn for the sum of five thousand dollars; and the state treasurer shall pay over such moneys to said county treasurer upon said orders; and such moneys shall be disbursed by said county treasurer upon the orders of said board of county commissioners, towards paying off the costs of the construction of said bridge.

When State Auditor to draw order—in what amount.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CII.

An Act to appropriate money for the improvement of the State Prison, Yard, Fence and Buildings.

March 9, 1869.

SECTION 1. Appropriations from the General Revenue Fund:

1. For purchasing land for enlargement of State Prison grounds.
 2. For tearing down old shop buildings and erecting new.
 3. For removing old dry house and the erection of a new one.
 4. For building wall and fence.
 5. For grading yard.
 6. For laying pipe and carrying water into yard.
2. Said sums to be expended under the direction of the inspectors.
3. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money, or so

much thereof as may be necessary, be, and the same are hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury belonging to the general revenue fund not otherwise appropriated:

Appropriations
from general
revenue fund.

First—\$1,300 for the purchasing of land necessary for enlarging state prison grounds.

Second—\$8,000 for the tearing down old shop buildings, and the erection of new, suitable for the business in said prison carried on.

Third—\$2,500 for removing old dry house, and the erection of a new one.

Fourth—\$2,500 For building wall and fence.

Fifth—\$2,000 for grading yard.

Sixth—\$500 for laying pipe and hose, and carrying water into yard.

Under whose di-
rection to be ex-
pended.

SEC. 2. That the said several sums shall be expended under the direction of the state prison inspectors, and for the purposes for which they are especially appropriated, and the said inspectors are hereby authorized to supervise, oversee, direct and supervise the work to be performed and improvements to be made, and shall cause the same to be done in any manner they may think proper. Said inspectors may, from time to time as said work and improvements progress, draw their orders in favor of parties to whom money is due, appropriated for the purposes herein, and upon presentation of such orders, the state auditor shall draw his order on the state treasurer for the amount thereof.

When act to
take effect.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
