## CHAPTER XXVIII.

March 5, 1869.

An Act to amend Subdivision Ninth of Section Fifteen of Chapter Ten of the General Statutes, relating to the power of Electors at annual town meetings.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Sub-division nine (9) of Section fifteen (15) of the General
Statutes. To vote to raise money for all necessary purposes—authorized
to expend an amount of poll tax on the highway of an adjoining town.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That subdivision ninth, of section fifteen, of the general statutes, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Vote to raise money—may expend poli tax on highway of an adjoining town.

Ninth. To vote to raise such sums of money for the repair and construction of reads and bridges, for the support of the poor, and for other necessary town charges as they deem expedient; Provided, That they may at their annual town meeting direct such an amount of the poll and road tax of the town to be expended on the highways in an adjoining town as they deem conducive to the interests of the town; which labor and tax shall be expended under the direction of the supervisors of the town furnishing the same; Provided further, That where more than one entire congressional township is included within an organized town, the poll and road tax raised within the limits of each of such congressional townships, shall be expended within such congressional township unless raised to be expended outside of such organized town, in an adjoining town.
