

CHAPTER XXXII.

An Act to amend Section one hundred and four of Chapter eight of the General Statutes, relating to the powers of County Commissioners. March 4, 1869.

- SECTION 1. Amendment to Section one hundred and four (104) of Chapter eight (8) of the General Statutes. Powers of Boards of Commissioners.
2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one hundred and four of chapter eight of the general statutes, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

Sec. 104. Said board have final power to examine and settle all accounts of the receipts and expenditures of the county, and shall have the care of the county property and the management of the county funds and business, except in cases otherwise provided for; but shall exercise no other powers than such as are given by law. Such board shall, in addition to the powers above enumerated, have power to set off, organize and vacate towns, and change the boundaries thereof in their respective counties, to designate the time and place of holding the first election therein, and make all necessary orders for the disposition and preservation of the records of any town which may be vacated by said board. *Provided*, That no town shall be vacated, nor any town with an area of thirty-six sections or less be divided or have any part stricken therefrom without first submitting the question to a vote of the electors of the town, except in the cases provided for in section two (2) of chapter ten of said general statutes.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
