An Act to amend Chapter thirty six, Section one, of the Session Laws of one thousand eight hundred and sixtyseven, relating to the payment of bounties for the destruction of wolves.

- SECTION 1. Amendment to Section one (1) of Chapter thirty-six (38) of the Session

 Laws of 1867. Bounty for the killing of wolves in the organized counties of this State.
 - 2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That section one of chapter thirty-six of the session laws of one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, of this state, relating to the payment of bounties for the destruction of wolves, be amended to read as follows:

Bounty for killing wolves. Section 1. That any person who shall kill any wolf or wolves within any organized county in this state, shall be entitled to receive for each wolf so killed a bounty or reward of three dollars.

When act to take effect.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force after April 1, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.
