

at the expense of said county, and to transcribe into such book or books all judgments and entries of the same to the extent that the same may be necessary, and all declarations of intentions to become citizens of the United States, and all final papers of citizens now on file in his office, but not of record, and index the same in alphabetical order.

SEC. 2. The said judgments, the docket or docket entries of the same, and the said declarations of intentions, and the said final papers so recorded and transcribed into such new books, shall be and remain as valid and of the same validity, force and effect as the original records, and no judgment or other record shall be affected or impaired thereby.

Not to affect the validity of documents.

SEC. 3. The said clerk shall receive and be paid out of the county treasury for the services hereinbefore required, fifteen cents for each folio actually copied by him.

Fees of clerk.

SEC. 4. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

When act to take effect.

CHAPTER CIII.

An Act to protect the Fish in Prairie Lake, in the County of Dakota. Feb'y 24, 1870.

- SECTION 1. Manner in which fish may be caught in said lake—penalty for violation of provisions of this act.
2. When actions may be brought for violation of the provisions of this act—dispositions of funds arising from fines collected.
 3. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That if any person or persons shall spear, net or in any way or manner except with hook and line

take or catch any fish in or from Prairie Lake, in the county of Dakota, in said state, such person or persons shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in the sum of five dollars for each and every fish so speared, netted, or in any manner taken or caught as aforesaid therefrom, except with hook and line, and such person or persons shall stand committed to the county jail of said county until such fine be paid.

When suits may be brought for violating this act—disposition of fines collected.

SEC. 2: That all prosecutions under this act shall be commenced within one year from the time of the commission of any offense thereunder, and not afterwards, and the same shall be upon complaint, under oath, before any justice of the peace in said county, and all fines imposed and collected under this act shall be paid into the treasury of said county, for the use of the common schools therein.

When act to take effect.

SEC. 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CIV.

An Act to amend an act entitled an act to authorize the County Commissioners of the County of Benton to issue bonds for the purpose of erecting a bridge over the Mississippi River, at Sauk Rapids, approved March ninth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

March 3, 1870.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section One (1) of Chapter Sixty-Eight (68) of the Special Laws of 1867. Strike out "seven," and insert "ten."

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one, of chapter sixty-eight, of the special laws of one thousand eight hundred and
