An Act to Promote Immigration.

- SECTION 1. Board of Immigration—of whom to consist—duties of Board.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. There is hereby created a board of immigration to consist of the governor, secretary of state and state treasurer, John C. Devereux and David C. Evans, whose duty it shall be to meet at the capitol, at St. Paul, on the first Tuesday after the adjournment of the present session of the legislature, and as often thereafter as they shall deem necessary, to consider communications that may have been forwarded to the secretary of state by parties taking an interest in the subject of immigration, and to adopt measures which will insure the establishment of a thorough system of inducing immigration to the state.

SEC. 2. The members of this board shall, if deemed advisable and proper, engage suitable correspondents, distribute articles publish, or cause to be published, pamphlets and articles relative to the retreating on, and describing in a true light the developed and undeveloped resources of the state of Minnesota, and to distribute them in such localities, wherever, in their opinion, they may be useful, beneficial and of good for

the promotion of immigration to this state.

SEC. 3. Whenever deemed expedient, the said board Board to appoint shall also have power to appoint agents for the purpose agents and allow of siding protecting and advising immigrants on their compensation. of aiding, protecting and advising immigrants on their way to this state; such agents to act solely under the instructions of the board of immigration, and to receive such compensation out of the fund hereinafter provided, as said board may fix and determine.

SEC. 4. The said board shall have power to hire or May lease bourse lease houses at such places in this state, as it may seem _for what pur. proper, for the protection or keeping of poor and needy pose. immigrants, until they can reach their place of destination.

SEC. 5. The sum of ten thousand dollars is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not other- Board to control wise appropriated, for the use of the said board of immining what amount. gration, to be expended by them in such manner as they may think best to carry out the objects of this act.

SEC. 6. The board of immigration is furthermore authorized, and shall have power to open books and invite Board to sollels and solicit contributions and endowments of money from contributions. corporations, manufacturers, merchants and all persons benefited by the flow of immigration; which money, so contributed, shall also be under the control and expended by the board for the interest and purposes stated in the preceding sections.

Sec. 7.
